• Why is transition finance chosen as the theme?

Promoting the decarbonization of the economy on the financing front has been the main pillar of FinCity.Tokyo's business plan, and thus it has been releasing information on transition finance to stakeholders in Japan and abroad.

It is essential to enhance transition finance in order to decarbonize the economy. Globally, the crisis in Ukraine and severe supply constraints have prompted changes in strategies for combating climate change.

Japan and the city of Tokyo are driving policies for achieving the targets of the Paris Agreement. They can take advantage of their abundant financial assets and competitive environmental technologies in that endeavor.

It is also necessary to share an understanding of transition finance with Asian countries that have clusters of manufacturers and thus face common challenges.
